OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD (PART 1)

Matthew 1:23 (KJV) Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us.

As you can see from the above scripture, the idea of the coming of Jesus was to help God come closer to his people. The real birth certificate name for Jesus was Emmanuel and the name means God with us. The intention of God is to have a dwelling among his people.

Jesus came so that we can have a reconciliation with God because God loves to live amongst his people. It is now possible for anyone to have a personal relationship with God without feeling any guilt because Jesus made that possible. Read **2 Corinthians 5:19**. OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD (PART 2)

Hebrews 2:11-12 (KJV) For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified are all of one: for which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethren, Saying, I will declare thy name unto my brethren, in the midst of the church will I sing praise unto thee.

Dear believers of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ....

The above given scripture should obviously do something to your spirit if you look at it closely. It shows us clearly how Jesus views us and who exactly we are in him.

The scripture is showing us clearly that Jesus is not afraid to call us, BRETHREN. Jesus does not present us to the Father with a title of servants but of his brethren. We are one and the same with him. We were raised to the level of Jesus that is why we have fellowship with God now (1 Corinthians 1:9).

I was excited in my spirit when I read the scripture, when I found out how Jesus speaks about us before the Father. He calls us my brethren, not my servants, not my people, not my laborers but MY BRETHREN. Brethren means one of us or our type, part of our group, a brother or a relative in faith.

So, when Jesus is referring to us as HIS BRETHREN, he is actually saying, we are of his type. Remember **1 John 4:17(KJV)** "Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as he is, so are we in this world." AS HE IS, SO ARE WE IN THIS WORLD. We have become like Jesus.

Finally brethren, consider the words of Apostle Paul in **Romans 8:17 (KJV)** "And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together."

Look at

the phrase "joint-heirs with Christ, "does it shock you that you have been elevated to the level of Christ? You and Christ are now joint heirs of God. The same things Jesus has, the same qualities that he has you now also have.

The same righteousness, the same quality of life (eternal life) that Jesus has we also now have (1 John 5:11), the same Holy Spirit that was at work at the resurrection of Jesus has also come upon us (Romans 8:11), the same title that Jesus had of being called SON OF GOD we now have it also (Romans 8:15-16) ... That is why we are called his brethren... Hallelujah.
